Since the girls camp is 2 days longer, its price is a bit higher than for the boys.
The charge includes the cost of the hostel, food, insurance, outings and organisation.

However they should contact Fr. Biérier before the camp.

If **any family**, due to the number of children, **could not pay** the whole fees, please contact Fr Biérier. The **prices** listed above **are not** an absolute obligation. The main purpose of the Camp is the spiritual welfare of children.

The camp starts for the girls at 5 pm on Friday and ends with Sunday Mass
For the boys it starts with Sunday Mass and finishes at Noon on Saturday

A few things to know

What to bring to the Camp

The campers should bring a Missal, Rosary beads and any prayer or spiritual reading book they wish (and a mantilla for the girls). They may bring their own camera for the camp.

The hostel provides beds, mattresses and pillows, so campers should bring sheets or a sleeping bag and a pillow case

Please give your children :

Enough clothes for a week (10 days for the girls)

Shoes for outside activities;

1 set of nicer clothes and shoes for Mass.

Toiletries, towels and slippers.

Wellington boots and coat for rain.

What NOT to bring to the Camp

The bringing of food to camp (especially sweets, chocolate, crisps etc.) is strictly forbidden, since all meals are provided.

The use of all electronic games and computers, mp3 players, knives or similar items, as well as mobile phones, is forbidden.

Illness

In the event of a child or children having to be sent home from camp due to illness, it is necessary to have a contact reference for each parent or guardian to contact them (*see application form*).

Dress code

Modesty imposes for girls the wearing of a skirt (covering the knees) at all times and the covering of the head in the Chapel.

Camp Location

How to reach Sandville House Hostel,
Ballyconnell, Co. Cavan

Go to Cavan;

From Cavan take the N3 towards Enniskillen;

Pass through Belturbet;

Just outside Belturbet you find a roundabout.

Take the first left (N87) towards Ballyconnell;

Now, ~ 3 miles after Belturbet and ~2 miles before Ballyconnell you will find on your left

a big house on the side of a lake and this is 500 yards before the big Hotel called "Slieve Russel" (with a big golf course). If you pass it,

you have gone too far. So take the left turn at the big house and BEFORE the Slieve Russell Hotel;

Then follow the road with the big house now on your right and take the first road to the right, there is a sign for Sandville House;

After 100 yards~ take the entry at your right. You are at Sandville House Hostel.
